The course does a good job of incorporating current information/news (podcasts, daily news) with the theories and history we also read. Professor Leon also does a good job in mixing lecture slides with class discussion on different topics. I also felt the midterm exam was fair- you needed to study to do well but the professor did not make it in a way to trick students unfairly or anything.

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I enjoyed the amount of discussion during class. I also liked the 6-part project that we completed throughout the semester. Choosing a topic a learning so much about it was fun and the way the project was broken into pieces made it very manageable.

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I found the course difficult, mostly because I think the material is just out of my comfort zone- I had a difficult time understanding themes, not because it was presented poorly but because it's just not the kind of material that comes easily to me. The uses of multiple examples and discussion-driven classes really helped me understand a lot of the material better.
